## Chirpy Birds Tea for Two Party Napkins

Instructions by Bunny Gates

What tea party is complete without napkins? These are so quick to make and will add just the right finishing touch to the table setting.

## **Supplies**

2 Napkins

1 piece of cotton fabric in pink for the bird 5" x 5" Design collection #12403 Chirpy Birds, Design #12403-13 **Embroidery & Sewing Machine OESD Badgemaster** Steam-A-Seam 2 505 Temporary Spray Adhesive 202 Spray and Fix Temporary Spray Adhesive for Paper Patterns Isacord Threads



## **Prepare the Napkin**

Chalk or Water Based Marking Pen

- 1. Following the printing instructions that are included on your design collections, print a template of the design, to determine placement.
- 2. Place the templates on a corner of the napkin and mark the center of the design.

#### **Embroider the Appliqué**

- 1. Cut out the appliqué template for Chirpy Bird #12403-13.
- Fuse Steam-A-Seam 2 to the wrong side of the pink appliqué fabric.
- 3. Spray the back of the applique template with 202 Spray and Fix.
- Place the bird template on the right side of the pink fabric and cut out the bird.
- Cut the applique out, remove the paper template and set aside.
- 6. Hoop a piece of Badgemaster stabilizer.
- 7. Lightly spray the hooped stabilizer with the 505 Temporary Spray Adhesive.
- 8. Align the center placement of the bird on the napkin with the center of the hooped stabilizer.

# Chirpy Birds - Tea for Two Party Napkins Instructions

#### **Embroider the Appliqué**

9. Place the hoop on the embroidery machine and stitch color 1 of the Chirpy Bird design (picture 1).



10. Remove the protective paper from the back of the appliqué piece inside the stitched placement line so that it matches the stitching line (picture 2).



- 11. Finish stitching the Bird design.
- 12. Remove the hoop from the machine and the napkin from the hoop.
- 13. Carefully remove the stabilizer from the back (picture 3).
